Monthly Meeting Minutes

August 11, 2004

The August meeting of PPRAA was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Al Penney VO1NO followed by introductions around the room.

There were no silent keys noted. Since the Zero Beat was late being distributed, the July meeting minutes approval was deferred.

Kate WB9BAH presented her first **Treasurer's report**.

For the period 7/1/04– 7/31/04 income was \$62.62, **expenses** were \$43.17 (\$151.22 was collected at Field Day which reduced expenses). **Net** for the month was \$19.45.

For the period of 10/1/03– 8/11/04 (current fiscal year) **income** was \$7,017.93 and **expenses** were \$5,371.15 reflecting a positive net of \$1,646.78 year to date. Money collected for door prizes is accounted for and recorded in a separate account maintained by the Vice President. These books are available for review by the membership.

Al VO1NO presented his President's Report which consisted of thanks to Kate WB9BAH (and John) for hosting the annual picnic; announced the after meeting coffee get together was at Perkins on Chelton and Platte; mentioned that elections were upcoming and that a nominating committee needed to be formed;

Zero Beat editor; reminded membership of the upcoming Mountain Amateur Radio Club (MARC) annual Campfest; asked if there was interest in reviving regular foxhunting outings; and explained the purpose of the PPRAA reflector and encouraged everyone to sign up.

The guest speaker was Karen Wolfer owner and operator of Daystar Solar Energy talking about solar power from power grid independence to just enough to support an emergency radio station.

Her presentation was very informative and interesting and left us with a desire to further investigate how each of us better utilize solar energy to meet our needs. Meeting adjourned at 9:20.
