72 HOURS ALONE WILL YOU SURVIVE?

April 17 was the 100th anniversary of the San Francisco earthquake, a 7.7 to 7.8 (Richter) magnitude blow to a teeming metropolis that also sparked a raging fire. Between the two, the vast majority of the city was destroyed. Could it happen again? Oh yes. And not just in San Francisco. It's not just earthquakes. No matter where you live, something could happen: a mud slide, fire, tornado, terrorist attack, hurricane, tsunami -- the list goes on.

Created by (yep!) the San Francisco Office of Emergency Services, this site helps you prepare you and your family for an emergency, urging you to be able to take care of yourself for AT LEAST 72 hours. In a disaster you are NO ONE's priority. If you don't prepare, you can't expect anyone to come to your aid, since everyone else has his/her own family to worry about. It's up to you to use the information to prepare BEFORE the next disaster strikes.

Special Event: 200th Anniversary Zebulon Pike's Expedition

Two hundred years ago, on July 15, 1806, Zebulon Montgomery Pike left from St. Louis to explore part of the newly acquired Louisiana Purchase. Pike's trek took place at about the same time as the famous Lewis and Clark trip, but Pike published his journal four years before the official government-sponsored team published theirs. On November 15, 1806, Pike sighted the "grand" mountain that would later bear his name.

On July 15, 2006, the Colorado Springs Pioneers Museum will commemorate the event in Antlers Park, the site where a 1906 time capsule is buried. Join the Museum, the Colorado Springs Chorale, the Colorado Springs Conservatory, and the Pikes Peak Radio Amateur Association to commemorate Pike's sojourn.

The event in the park includes:

- 1806 period music performed by the Colorado Springs Chorale
- The opening of a time capsule that was buried at Colorado Springs' 100th anniversary Pike event
- A performance of a modern opera written especially for the event
- An amateur radio special event taking place from the park
- An opportunity to contribute to a time capsule that will be opened in 100 years

PPRAA will participate in the event by operating at least one HF station from 9 AM-1 PM. Those who make contact with Special Event Station AFØS will receive a special QSL card. The card, stamped on the back of an official US Postal Service Zebulon Pike commemorative postcard, is a limited edition. A color reproduction of a painting that depicts Pike and his entourage gazing at the peak is displayed on one side, with the QSL vitae for the contact stamped on the back.

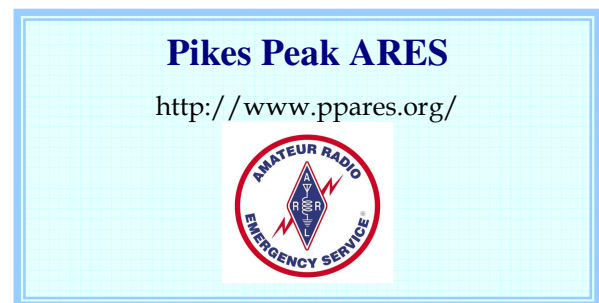
